CONCEPT NOTE

Introduction

For decades, women have continued to face a higher risk of financial and social vulnerability and exclusion, with humanitarian crises such as conflicts and pandemics further increasing such vulnerabilities and widening the gaps in development. With women facing disproportionate negative impacts of these crises, strategies that adequately account for and respond to the inclusion of gender-specific issues are necessary to ensure inclusion and equality.

Economic inclusion promotes the rights of women and their access to socioeconomic and financial assets and rights, creating opportunities and systems that enable self-sufficiency and strengthens the resilience of families and communities in times of hardship.





Panel Session

The panel session will convene key drivers in gender, inclusion and policy-making to provide critical insights on frameworks that promote women's economic inclusion and adopt gender-intentional programming while mitigating unintended negative gendered consequences.

The session will facilitate an interactive discussions with stakeholders to share sustainable strategies and solutions to closing the inequality gap that limits women's access to economic opportunities.
